- PROVENANCE Copied at St Gall (stamps, pp. 1, 176). Glosses in B perhaps by Ekkehard IV (d. 1060).

- GLOSS A few marginal headings, e.g. pp. 12–13. Miscellaneous notes throughout, but no systematic marginalia.
- DECORATION Major initial missing, p. 2; minor initials in plain ink.

- GLOSS Compilations from the commentaries of Ps.-Aquinas and William of Conches (Courcelle), *inc.* 'Sicut inquit philosophorum princeps Aristoteles eius Elicorum primo quod felicitas est bonum et summum et ultimum atque finale' (p. 7^a). Systematic commentary continues throughout. Subject headings in scribe's hand to each prose and metre, e.g., 'Conquestio B. de instabilitate fortune' (I.m.i: p. 9), executed in large letters and red underlining on p. 9, but thereafter only large letters with no colour.
- DECORATION Major initials to begin each book planned but not executed. Basic red capitals, e.g., pp. 7 and 9, but very little overall; no paraph signs.
- PROVENANCE Dr Caspar Wirt (pp. 1: s. xv). St Gall (stamp, p. 35).
